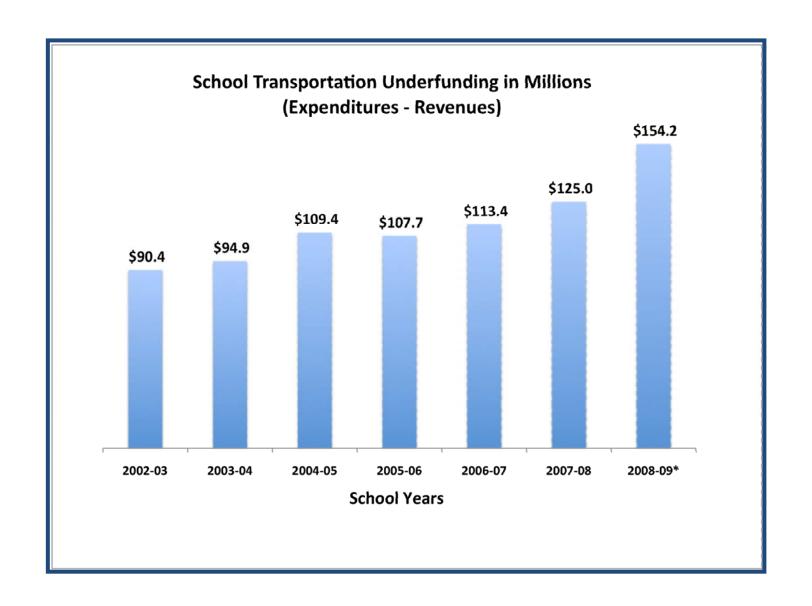

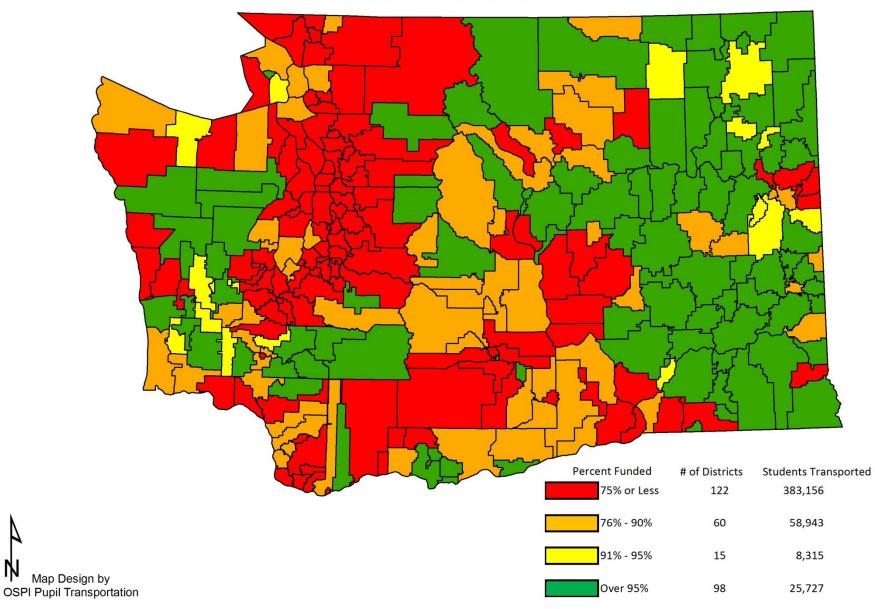
SHB 2261: Transportation Funding

- Required QEC to develop an implementation plan

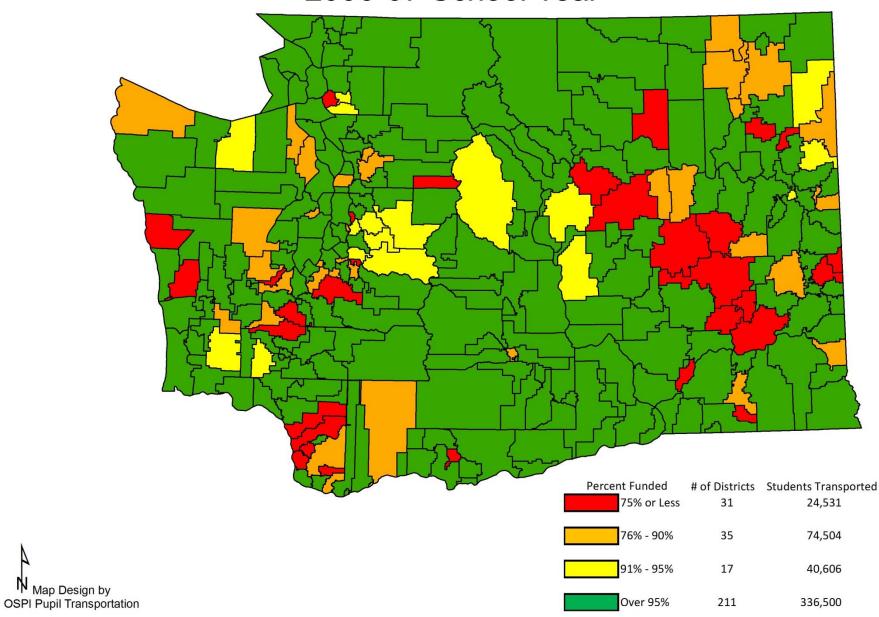
Report Elements

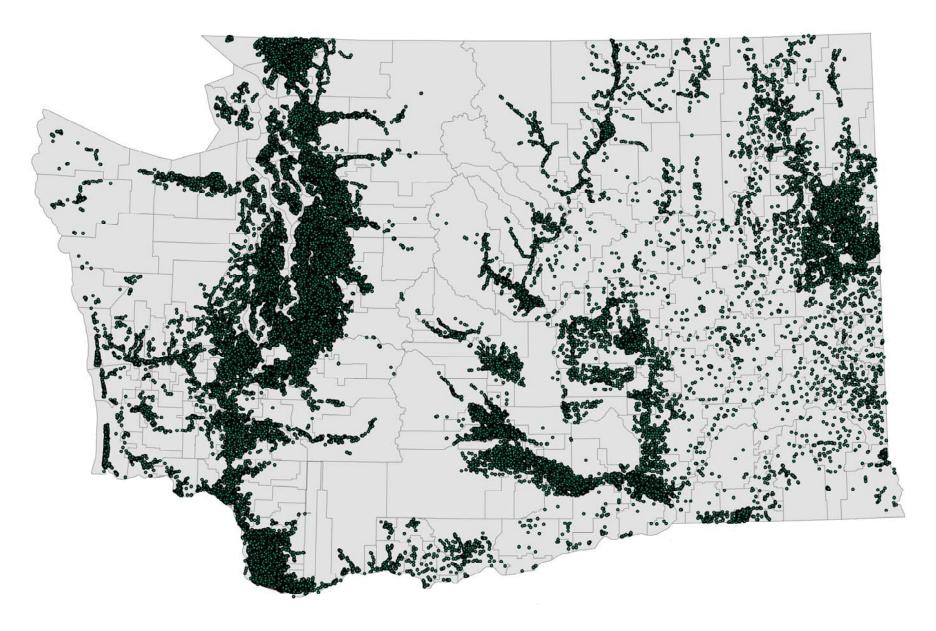
Pupil Transportation Current Funding Formula 2006-07 School Year

Walk Area

School Districts will be required to use a process similar to that described in the School Administrator's Guide to School Walk Routes and Student Pedestrian Safety.

Currently under revision by the Safe Routes to School program at WSDOT



School Administrator's Guide to School Walk Routes and Student Pedestrian Safety

Hold Harmless and Phase-in Process

- Districts provided with at least their previous year's allocation
 (but not more than previous year's expenditures)
- Additional allocation above the maintenance level is prorated using the new formula

Implementation Plan (1)

Time Period	Event
January – March 2010	Legislative Session: \$670K in Supplemental
April – June 2010	OSPI develops and posts RFP
July – September 2010	OSPI awards RFP and work begins

Implementation Plan (2)

Time Period	Event
2010 – 2011 School Year	School Districts establish walk areas
March 2011	System development complete
April 2011	Pilot test system

Implementation Plan (3)

Time Period	Event
May 2011	School bus stop data available for review
Sep. – Oct. 2011	Initial report with new system
November 2011	Adjust coefficients and report efficiency ratings
