A Musical Month

There are several great things happening with the Woodland High School music programs this month. Here are some summaries:

- Seven talented WHS singers will be participating in the Lower Columbia River Music Educators Association (LCRMEA) Honor Choir held on Saturday, February 3rd. They were nominated earlier in the year and will sing with a group of 120 talented high school singers from our Lower Columbia region.
- A Woodland High School performer auditioned back in September and was chosen to sing in this year's Washington Music Educators' Association (WMEA) All-State Treble Choir. This is a huge honor! She will represent Woodland High School singing with about 150 other talented singers from all over the state of Washington in Yakima on February 16th and 17th.
- February 2nd and 3rd are the dates that the North County Honor Band meet at Hockinson High School for both high school and middle school rehearsals and our final concert. This year, we have five students participating, four from the middle school and one from the high school. This year's music selections for competition are TOUGH, especially an incredible piece called "Big Four on the River."
- Finally, Taste of Jazz will occur on February 22nd, right on cue!

Forecasting Season

It's the time of year when WHS counselors and teachers start to talk with our 9th through 11th graders about course planning for next year. For students, it often seems like a mundane task that's mainly about which class is going to happen during which period. Really, it's about much more than that. It's actually about building options after high school.

I'll say more about career forecasts in a later edition, <u>but this</u> <u>page from the bureau of labor statistics</u> gives us a valuable snapshot. The highest growth careers are in health care (nursing, health care management, physician assistants), data management (statisticians, data management), and wind turbine service technicians. All of these careers require post secondary education, and a strong high school transcript is the best way for students to create options for themselves after high school.

During our student led conferences in late March, you will have an opportunity to meet with your student's GRIT teacher and talk over the courses your student is planning to take. This will be a great opportunity to talk with your student about hopes and dreams for the future and how to prepare to take ahold of those things.

CHARACTER STRONG LESSONS HAPPEN ONCE A WEEK IN GRIT (Gratitude - Resilience - Integrity - Team) In February ~

- The freshmen class will be learning ways to seek out emotional support from others, identify how we can support our own mental and emotional health in positive ways, and explore our personal values by identifying the most influential people in our lives.
- Sophomore students will learn how to deal with stress by developing coping mechanisms, achieving growth mindsets, and practicing forgiveness.
- Junior students will learn to recognize barriers in school to belonging, how to ask for support, as well as learn how to overcome barriers. They will end the month by learning about patience: what it is, its impact, and how to practice it.
- The senior class is focusing on finding the small, weekly habits that improve their well-being and how they can use their time for activities that align with their values. They end the month by exploring the components of effective empathy and using perspective-taking to create action steps to improve the school environment.




