Options and Aspirations

In today's rapidly evolving economy, it's natural to wonder about the best path to ensure your teenager's future success. Career and Technical Education (CTE) offers a compelling alternative with promising job prospects.

The Career and Technical Education (CTE) sector, vital for economic growth and innovation, is currently facing a significant challenge: a widening skills gap. This gap refers to the discrepancy between the skills employers need and the skills available in the workforce. In CTE fields, this translates to a shortage of skilled workers in crucial industries such as healthcare, technology, and advanced manufacturing.

Several factors contribute to this skills gap. Firstly, technological advancements and automation are quickly transforming industries. This rapid pace of change requires workers with up-to-date technical skills and adaptability to keep up with the changing demands.

Secondly, an aging workforce is causing the skills gap to widen. As experienced workers retire, they take with them valuable knowledge and expertise that are not easily replaced. Additionally, negative perceptions about CTE careers and a lack of awareness about their potential can discourage young people from pursuing these paths, further contributing to the skills gap.

The consequences of the skills gap in CTE careers are far-reaching. For businesses, it can lead to decreased productivity, innovation, and competitiveness. It can also hinder their ability to expand and create new jobs. For individuals, it can result in unemployment or underemployment, as well as missed opportunities for fulfilling and well-paying careers.

Given the current job market, CTE career fields with promising job prospects include those in **healthcare** (such as nursing, medical assisting, and phlebotomy), technology (such as cybersecurity, programming, and network administration), and advanced manufacturing (such as welding, machining, and automation). While most of these career paths require some post secondary training or education, many alternatives exist for students who do not chose to pursue a 4 year degree at a university or college.

... Cascadia Technical Academy and Lower Columbia College. Both of theses institutions offer strong, specialized course options in a wide range of CTE fields. Two of the Cascadia programs - Education and Pre Electrical Trades - are hosted at Woodland School District properties and boast strong enrollments from Woodland students. Currently, Woodland High School offers in-house programs in Floral Management, Horticulture, Culinary Arts, Metals, and Business. In looking to the future, our goal is to expand offerings in Metals and Construction Trades and Business and Finance. As your student begins forecasting for their courses next spring, be sure to ask them about their options in CTE.

Forecasting Season

Over the next 6 - 10 weeks, staff will begin working with the 8th through 11th graders on forecasting for next year's classes. It seems like it comes earlier every year, but really, it doesn't. Time just moves more quickly every year!

Here are the things your students will be doing over the coming weeks to prepare for next year's course scheduling. In mid February, teachers will begin preparing course recommendations for students by subject area. In many cases, students will be involved in creating those course recommendations. In late February, students will work with their GRIT teachers to identify potential courses for next year. Shortly before spring break, students will discuss their identified course plans with parents and guardians as a part of their Student Led Conferences.

Woodland High School DECA recognized for Achievement Level Chapter Campaign

Woodland, WA – Woodland High School DECA was recently awarded the Thrive Level Campaigns for the 2024-2025 school year. The results were announced on decadirect.org.

Each fall, DECA recognizes leading chapters that have built strong local programs focused on serving an exceptional number of members, advisors, alumni and business partners. These chapters and individuals dedicate their year to academic and career preparation, community service projects, membership recruitment, school outreach activities and other DECA-related endeavors. The chapter's advisor and student leaders have demonstrated extraordinary commitment to DECA.

DECA's membership campaign is designed to help chapters grow by making the DECA experience available to more student members, keeping alumni involved and engaging professional members such as administrators, teachers, parents and business partners.

DECA's promotional campaign provides chapter members an opportunity to share with their school and community what DECA is all about and how their chapter is making a positive impact on its members and community.
