Dike Access Road Site

Development Time: 48 months • Cost estimate: \$57.95 million

PROS »

- Continued use of existing school bus facility
- Expansion room for additional buildings
- Possible cost-sharing with neighboring properties under construction

CONS »

- On-site wetlands require mitigation and additional scrutiny during construction which increase costs
- Requires more extensive off-site road and frontage improvements than existing campus
- Will probably require surcharging and mass grading
- Requires transportation or bell schedule modification which generate additional operating costs

Current Site

Development Time: 42 months • Cost estimate: \$55.8 million

PROS »

- Allows for the option to reuse certain existing facilities such as performing arts center, track, fields and parking
- Probably no wetland mitigation or additional surcharging and mass-grading
- No modification to transportation system or bell schedules

CONS »

- Requires the construction/relocation of the school bus facility
- Less space for future expansion as schools grow in size
- May require replacement of 1 or 2 existing sewer pump stations
