Re: 2013-14 Special Education Safety Net Funding

Dear Mr. Green,

After careful consideration by the Special Education State Oversight Committee on June 18-19, the safety net application as submitted by the district on March 28, 2014, was conditionally approved for \$23,748 based on demonstration of capacity on Worksheet A and a properly formulated IEP(s) presented in the district's application. The district's High Need Conditional Award Summary is enclosed. Contingent upon verification of final demonstrated capacity at the individual and/or district level in August 2014, state safety net funding will be provided in revenue account 4121 through the apportionment process. Federal IDEA funding will be provided pending completion of a budget in iGrants Special Education Safety Net IDEA-B Form Package 269.

Superintendents and Business Managers may find comments regarding recalculations and/or corrections to the requested amounts in the column labeled "Fiscal Adjustments" of the High Need Conditional Award Summary. Directors of special education will receive a copy of the High Need Conditional Award Summary and the IEP Review Forms used by committee members to identify any IEP related issues. Districts should pay particular attention to the comments made by the reviewers.

For the Committee to verify Worksheet A capacity at the August safety net meeting, your district must:

- 1. Submit via e-mail, **no later than July 31, 2014**, *detailed* expenditure reports through the month of July for Programs 21, 22, 24, 26 and 29. *Detailed* expenditure reports should show budgeted and actual year-to-date expenditures sorted by program and totaled at activity/object level. Reports should be e-mailed to <u>Maryellen</u>. <u>Parrish@k12.wa.us</u>.
- 2. Be current on all federally funded special education grant claims, and
- 3. Explain differences (if any) between the annualized year-to-date expenditures and remaining unencumbered balances. Districts must provide an explanation of remaining encumbrances including purchase orders, if needed.

To verify individual student need, your district **must**:

- 1. Return, **no later than July 31, 2014**, the enclosed listing of students funded for extended school year (ESY) services during the 2013–14 school year. Insert a check mark next to each SSID number indicating the student received ESY services. The report should be e-mailed to <a href="maileo-amber.odonnell@k12.wa.us">amber.odonnell@k12.wa.us</a>, and
- 2. Advise OSPI, **no later than July 31, 2014**, of the student's exit date if any student for whom the district received a safety net award exited the district in the 2013–14 school year.

The district should be aware that this safety net award is not an entitlement and is subject to recovery pending yearend district fiscal data and/or fiscal audit by the State Auditor's Office. Districts may request review and reconsideration of an action of the state oversight committee within twenty days of the date of this letter. For guidelines regarding request for review and reconsideration, see WAC 392-140-656.
