- 1. Initial feelings about Kindergarten full day every day?
 - Would give us a more complete chance to help students meet state expectations.
 - It is necessary
 - We would have more lesson follow through
 - Students would learn the routines so much faster that the academics could be more indepth.
- 2. How would a schedule like this affect you and the work you do in your classroom?
 - My work would be more productive because the lessons would be able to be carried
 across days. Now they have to end due to students not coming back to school for 1-4
 days.
 - It would give me the opportunity to be more developmentally appropriate.
 - I would be able to go more in-depth with curriculum.
 - I wouldn't be so rushed to get 180 days of instruction solid in 90 days.
- 3. How would such a schedule impact students?
 - Positively... children thrive on steady daily routines. Especially ELL and high needs students.
 - The consistency would be good for students.
- 4. How would such a schedule impact families?
 - Positively... a steady routine for child care and home management
 - Parents wouldn't be tempted to move their children to other districts that offer full day.
- 5. What instructional decisions will need to change?
 - I don't think any-standards are the same you would still teach to the state standards.
 - More interventions would be provided in class by the teacher because of increased student contact time.
 - My instruction wouldn't be so rush and could be more in-depth.
- 6. How would this model impact our current curriculum offerings?
 - Positively, Read Well is based on a 5 day per week model.
 - I would have more time to teach math, science and writing.
