Financial Statement required communications

In relation to our report, we would like to bring to your attention:

 Uncorrected misstatements in the audited financial statements are listed below. We agree with management's representation that these misstatements are immaterial to the fair presentation of the financial statements.

The District netted the underwriter discount and refunding bond proceeds inappropriately. This resulted in Other Financing Sources and Expenditures in the Debt Service Fund being understated by \$15.300.

• There were no material misstatements in the financial statements corrected by management during the audit.

Recommendations not included in the Audit Reports

Exit Items

We have provided exit recommendations for management's consideration. Exit items address control deficiencies or non-compliance with laws or regulation that have an insignificant or immaterial effect on the entity, or errors with an immaterial effect on the financial statements. Exit items are not referenced in the audit report.
