


Do the videos provide sufficient variety to present opposing views of controversial issues in order that students can make a informed decision?



The video covers the definition of puberty, the endocrine system, hormones, and the changes at puberty that both boys and girls have in common. "HIV and Me: Marissa's Story" is the short video used to talk with 5th Grade students regarding HIV/AIDS. It includes a teacher resource guide, teacher background information, learning objectives, and discussion guides. Do you feel this is age appropriate for this student population?



"Understanding HIV: Learn the Facts, Fight the Stigma, and Stay Safe" is the short video used to talk with 6th Grade students regarding HIV/AIDS. 
"HIV and AIDS" is the short video used to talk with 7th Grade students

regarding HIV/AIDS. This video uses appropriate language to clearly show how HIV is transmitted and attacks the immune system. Two on-camera physicians answer kids' questions about AIDS. Video also address how any type of sexual activity with another person is not appropriate at this age. Do you feel this is age appropriate for this student population?

"Understanding HIV and AIDS" is a short video used to talk with 8th Grade students that reviews the basic terms, definitions, and biology of the HIV virus, treatment, and protections. I feel the videos provide students with important information about the changes occurring with their bodies, while also being culturally sensitive and appropriate for the targeted age group.

The videos in this series align with the OSPI Health Standards for 5th-8th Grade Students.

I feel like these videos explain difficult subjects in ways that make sense for each age group. They use simple explanations instead of long, medical terms. They go into enough detail so that students understand but do not give them an over-abundance of information.

I feel 6th grade is an appropriate grade to introduce these topics. I feel the curriculum selected effectively introduces and educated the topics.

No, the only thing I felt that was not appropriate was the discussion guide after the HIV/AIDS videos.


