REMEDIATION PROGRAMS

The district, within its financial capacity, will offer programs that are designed to meet the needs of educationally disadvantaged students. Eligible students may receive services from <u>onea</u> variety of <u>three</u> special needs programs <u>_____. Including</u> special education, learning assistance <u>program (LAP)</u> and Title I (of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act).

The district or individual school <u>willshall</u> conduct a needs assessment and <u>willshall</u> develop a plan for the use of LAP funds. Such a plan <u>willshall</u> be determined in consultation with an advisory committee, including, but not limited to, parents of participants₂; teachers₂; principals₂; other administrators, and school directors. The plan <u>willshall</u> include:

- A. A. District and school-level data on reading, writing and mathematics achievement;
- **B. B. Processes to identify under-achieving students to be served at each site for program services;**
- <u>C.</u> <u>C.</u> How accelerated learning plans are developed and implemented for participating schools;
- D. D. How state and classroom assessments are used to inform instruction;
- E. E. How focused and intentional instruction strategies are identified and implemented;
- **F.** F. How highly qualified staff are developed and how staff will support the program at each site;
- <u>G.</u> <u>G.</u> How resources from other federal, state, district and school programs are coordinated with School Improvement <u>plans</u> and district strategic plans to support underachieving students;
- H. H. How a program evaluation will be conducted to determine the direction and elements of the program for the following school year; and
- I. I.—Identification of the program activities the district will implement.

The plan <u>willshall</u> be approved by the board of directors prior to submission to the state.

In compliance with the federal law, the board of directors adopts a parent involvement policy, developed jointly with, agreed upon by, and distributed to the parents of children participating in the federal remediation program. The parent involvement policy is <u>4130</u>. Policy No. 4130 Title I Parental Involvement.

The superintendent is directed to identify eligible students and their special needs<u>and</u>; design <u>programsa program(s)</u> that will satisfy those needs by <u>combining federal remediation assistance</u> <u>programscoordinating</u>, when advantageous, Title I, learning assistance <u>programs (LAP)</u>, and special education services. The superintendent will; monitor the progress of such programs; and provide assurances to state and federal agencies that such programs are in compliance with program requirements <u>regarding of each program with regard to conditions such as</u> staff qualifications, staff-student ratios, student records, facilities and materials, financial accounting, reporting and program and student evaluation.
