## **Career and Technical Education**

The district will provide a program of <u>career Career</u> and <u>technical education Technical Education</u> to assist students in making <u>of</u> informed and meaningful educational and career choices, and to prepare students for post-secondary options. The district's <u>career Career</u> and <u>technical education Technical Education</u> is a planned program of courses and learning experiences that begins with exploration of career options. Additionally, the district's <u>career Career</u> and <u>technical education Technical Education</u> program supports basic academic and life skills, enables achievement of high academic standards, incorporates leadership training, provides options for high skill development and high-wage employment preparation, and includes advanced and continuing education courses. <u>The district will include the The program and its courses will be included</u> as part of the regular curriculum of the district.

The district will establish local <u>career Career</u> and <u>technical advisory committees Technical Advisory Committees</u> to assist in the design and delivery of the district's <u>career Career</u> and <u>technical education Technical Education</u> program. Committees will advise the district on current labor market needs and the programs necessary to meet those needs. The <u>district will relate its career district's Career</u> and <u>technical education Technical Education</u> program <u>will be related</u> to employment demands, current and future, and to the needs and interests of students.

The board will annually review and approve the district plan for the design and delivery of its <u>careerCareer</u> and <u>technical education</u> program. The plan will ensure academic rigor, align with education reform, establish program performance targets, address the skill gaps of Washington's economy, and provide opportunities for dual credit.

The superintendent <u>or designee</u> will develop procedures <u>towhich will</u> ensure that <u>the district operates</u> all programs and courses <u>are operated</u> in conformity with the district's plan for <u>careerCareer</u> and <u>technical</u> education. Further, the associated procedures will conform to all federal Technical Education and <u>statewith all Federal and State</u> laws prohibiting discrimination based on race, creed, color, national origin, <u>disability, gender</u>, sex, sexual orientation, <u>including</u> gender expression, <u>gender-or</u> identity, <u>disability</u> (<u>including the presence of any sensory, mental, <u>or</u> physical disability, <u>or</u> the use of a trained dog guide, and use of <u>or</u> service animal), religion, and honorably discharged veteran or military status. Additionally, the superintendent <u>or designee</u> will seek and utilize all available state and federal sources of revenue for the financial support of <u>careerCareer</u> and <u>technical educationTechnical Education</u> in the district.</u>

If the district receives funds through the work-integrated learning initiative to provide experiences for its students, it will comply with the conditions of receiving such funds.
