HOLIDAYS

The district will comply with RCW 28A.150.050 which states:

<u>The following are school holidays willshall observe the following school holidays and school shall may not be taught operate on these days:</u>

1. Sunday;

- 2. The first day of January, commonly called New Year's Day (January 1);
- <u>3.</u> 1), <u>The third Monday of January, celebrated as the anniversary of the birth of Martin</u> Luther King, Jr. <u>Day (third Monday in January)</u>;
- 4. <u>)</u>, The third Monday of February, to be known as President's' Day (third Monday in February) and celebrated as the anniversary of the births of Abraham Lincoln and George Washington;
- 5.), The last Monday in May, commonly known as Memorial Day (last Monday in May);
- 6.), The fourth day of July, the anniversary of the Declaration of Independence Day (July 4) :
- 7.), The first Monday in September, to be known as Labor Day (first Monday in September);
- <u>8.</u>), <u>The eleventh day of November, to be known as Veteran's</u> <u>Day (November 11)</u>:
- 10. The Friday immediately following the fourth Thursday in November, to be known as Native American Heritage Day), the day after Thanksgiving: and
- <u>11.</u>, the day before Christmas (December 24), The twenty-fifth day of December, commonly called Christmas Day (December 25).

No reduction from a teacher's time or salary may be made by reason of the fact that a school day happens to be one of the days referred to as a day on which school is not taught.

The district will comply with RCW 1.16.060 to the extent it applies to school districts.

1) Whenever any state legal holiday:

(a) Other than Sunday, falls upon a Sunday, the following Monday is the legal holiday; or (b) Falls upon a Saturday, the preceding Friday is the legal holiday.

2) School District employees are entitled to two unpaid holidays per calendar year for a reason of faith or conscience or an organized activity conducted under the auspices of a religious

denomination, church, or religious organization. The employee may select the days on which the employee desires to take the two unpaid holidays after consultation with the employer. If an employee prefers to take the two unpaid holidays on specific days for a reason of faith or conscience, or an organized activity conducted under the auspices of a religious denomination, church, or religious organization, the district must allow the employee to do so unless the employee's absence would impose an undue hardship.

), and the day before New Year's Day (December 31). Whenever any legal holiday, other than a <u>Sunday</u>, falls on Sunday, the following Monday <u>will</u>shall be a legal holiday_; and whenever any legal holiday falls on a Saturday, the preceding Friday <u>will</u>shall be a legal holiday.
