Congratulations! Because of the tremendous gains your students have made in their mathematics and reading skills over the past several years, your school has earned the State Superintendent's Learning Improvement Award and will be recognized as a 2008 "School of Distinction." While you and your superintendent are receiving early notice of this award, please use discretion in sharing the news, as recipients of these awards will not be announced publicly until later in October.

This award celebrates the top five percent of elementary, middle, high and alternative schools that exceeded this year's state average performance on the Washington Assessment of Student Learning in reading and mathematics, as well as demonstrated outstanding improvement over time in both of those subjects. Your school is among just 100 statewide that will receive this recognition in 2008.

I created this award in 2007 to honor students, teachers, administrators, parents, schools and communities for the wonderful gains they've made in preparing our children to learn, work, live and succeed in the 21st century. It takes a lot of hard, tireless work and a true commitment to reach all of our students and help them be successful learners, and I am thrilled to be able to publicly honor your efforts.

The press conference and awards ceremony to honor this year's "schools of distinction" will take place at 9:30 a.m. on Oct. 22 at Garfield High School in Seattle. During the ceremony, you will receive an award. A reception will follow. If possible, please bring to the event the people who helped you accomplish these gains with your students – teachers, parent leaders, your superintendent, school board and community members.

While I hope you will be able to join me and your fellow honorees in Seattle, we also will hold regional recognition events the morning of Oct. 22. We will broadcast the press conference live via our statewide K-20 videoconferencing system, and a member of my staff will be on hand at eight regional locations outside the Seattle metro area to present awards to local schools.
