Searches of Students and Personal Property

Personal privacy is a fundamental aspect of individual liberty. All students possess the constitutional right to be secure in their persons, papers, and effects against unreasonable searches and seizures.

Staff will take particular care to respect students' privacy.

School officials have authority to maintain order and discipline in the schools and to protect students from exposure to illegal drugs, weapons, and contraband. The superintendent, the principal, and other staff designated by the superintendent have the authority to conduct reasonable searches on school property in accordance with the law.

Any authorized school official will conduct searches according to the procedure associated with this policy.

Student Privacy

Adult Students, Emancipated Minors, and Confidential Health Information

State law provides that at certain ages, students attain the right to decide for themselves what records will remain confidential, even from their parents, and what activities the student will participate in.

At age eighteen (18), students become legal adults and must approve any disclosure of information about themselves from school records, except directory information (if the adult studenta request for confidentiality has not opted out of disclosing directory information pursuant to Policy 3231 and Procedure 3231P). Such students been filed. Students at age eighteen may also sign releases, authorizations, or permission slips to participate in school activities, and may sign themselves out of school and authorize their own absences.

Students between sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) who have been granted legal emancipation from their parents or guardians have the same rights as eighteen--year--old students.-

• Students ageover fourteen (14) or olderyears of age have the right to keep privatefrom everyone any district confidentiality rights in records indicating that they have been tested or treated for a sexually transmitted disease.

Students age-thirteen (13) years and older have confidentiality rights in records regarding drug, alcohol, or mental health treatment.

All students have confidentiality rights in family planning or abortion records.

For purposes this policy, "contraband" means items, materials, or substances that students are oblibited from possessing by law or district policy, including, but not limited to, ntrolled substances, alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, or any object that can isonably be considered a firearm or a dangerous weapon. Therefore, the perintendent, building principals, and other staff designated by the superintendent shall ve the authority to conduct reasonable searches on district property as provided by ard policy and state and federal law.¶ search is required when there are reasonable grounds to suspect a student has a firearm school grounds or transportation or at school events.¶ ior to conducting a search, school officials shall ask that the student consent to be arched. If the student refuses to consent to the search, school officials may proceed to arch the student, and/or the student's personal belongings, as follows:¶ 1. Any search of a student or his or her personal property conducted by a school district employee must be reasonably related to the discovery of contraband or other evidence of a student's violation of the law or school rules.¶ 2. Employees shall conduct searches in a manner that is not excessively intrusive in light of the age and sex of the student and the nature of the suspected infraction.¶ student shall be subject to a strip search or body cavity search by district employees.¶

B. Searches of Lockers, Desks, or Storage Areas

Students may be assigned lockers for storing and securing their books, school supplies, and personal effects. Lockers, desks, and storage areas are the property of the school district. No right nor expectation of privacy exists for any student as to the use of any space issued or assigned to a student by the school. Lockers and other spaces are subject to scarch in accordance with district policy and state and federal law.

No student may use a locker, desk, or storage area to store any substance or object that is prohibited by law or school rules or that poses a threat to the health, safety or welfare of the occupants of the school building or the building itself.

Äny student's locker, desk, or other storage area shall be subject to search if reasonable grounds exist to suspect that the search will yield evidence of the student's violation of the law or school rules. Any search of an individual student's locker shall be conducted according to district policy governing personal searches.¶

All student lockers may be searched at any time without prior notice and without reasonable suspicion that the search will yield evidence of any particular student's violation of the law or school rules. If the school official conducting such a search develops a reasonable suspicion that any container inside the locker, including but not limited to a purse, backpack, gym bag, or an article of clothing, contains evidence of a student's violation of the law or school rules, the container may be searched according to district policy governing personal searches.

The superintendent shall establish procedures for conducting searches of lockers, desks, or storage areas.

C. Searches of Vehicles

Students may be allowed to park personal vehicles on district property, such as at school buildings and athletic facilities, for purposes of providing student transportation. Such vehicles are subject to search in accordance with district policy and state and federal law.

A student's vehicle will be subject to search if reasonable grounds exist to suspect that the search will yield evidence of the student's violation of the law or school rules. Any search of a student's vehicle will be conducted according to district policy governing personal searches.¶
