**THE FIRST PRIORITY** of Woodland Public Schools is **student learning**. Every day in every classroom, for every child, we seek to keep students actively engaged in quality learning. We depend on the **partnership and active support of our community** to help us achieve and sustain this priority.



- Woodland Public School District serves over 2200 students in six schools.
- Our average enrollment **growth** over the last ten years has been over 2%. If that rate of growth continues, we will add another 420 students in ten years.
- Woodland High School has graduated 101 classes. The class of 2009 was its largest ever with 152 students
- **Achievement** of students in Woodland Public Schools is strong. Woodland has a greater-than-average percentage of students who meet and exceed standards on the Washington Assessment of Student Learning.
- Woodland Public Schools **does not have enough permanent classrooms** to serve all of its students. The schools use two dozen temporary "portable" classrooms.
- Woodland Public Schools is **fiscally conservative**. We operate a balanced budget. We have one of the lowest ratios of administrators-to-students in the state.
- In the past school year, two schools received **School of Distinction Awards**: Woodland Intermediate School and TEAM high school. They were two of only 98 schools to receive the award statewide. This was the second year in a row for the Intermediate School to receive this honor.
- Woodland Public Schools strive to meet the needs of all students. This year, Woodland High School
  introduced a new strategy to increase student learning and development called the **Pyramid of**Intervention. Students who need extra support receive focused attention, support, and intervention.
